
Make your voice heard in Brooklyn

Brooklyn is effectively a one-party town where the Democratic primary winner almost always claims victory in the November elections. Make sure our borough has a healthy, functioning democracy by registering to vote locally and as a Democrat. To participate in upcoming elections:

Check your voting status and poll site location (including new early voting sites) at vote.nyc.ny.us.

Register to vote at your current address online (voting.nyc), by mail, or in person. You must be registered 25 days before an election to vote.

Update your party enrollment by February 14, 2020. You must be registered as a Democrat no later than February 14 to vote in the 2020 Democratic primaries.

New York passed new voting laws that expand your rights

Early voting allows you to vote at the polls over a nine day period (including two weekends) in advance of Election Day.

Combined state and federal primaries mean elections happen on the same day, except for the 2020 Democratic Presidential Primary on April 28. State and local Primary Day is June 23.

Pre-registration for 16- and 17-year-olds ensures young people can vote as soon as they turn 18.
